#### **Professor David Ford:**

Prof. David Ford is Professor of Health Informatics and leads the Health Informatics Group at Swansea University Medical School in Swansea University, Wales, UK. He is the Director of the Administrative Data Research Centre (ADRC) Wales, an £8 million investment by the Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) as part of it's Big Data initiative and is Deputy Director of The Farr Institute of Health Informatics Research UK, funded by a consortium of top UK research funders led by the Medical Research Council (MRC). Prof. Ford is the lead of the Secure Anonymised Information Linkage Databank, an internationally recognised data linkage resource formed from a wide variety of routinely collected data from across Wales. Prof. Ford has received research grants and consultancy contracts valuing over £35 million over recent years.

Prof. Paget's background was in psychiatric nursing, but took an early interest in health informatics via participating, then organising the European Summer School of Nursing Informatics through the 1990s. He has been a qualified higher education teacher since 1998 and helped design Swansea University's successful MSc in health informatics in 1999. He became the course director in 2011.
